Dr. Madeleine K. Albright has been President of the Center for National Policy in Washington, D.C. since 1989. She has been the Donner Professor of International Affairs and Director of the Women in Foreign Service Program at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service since 1982. Dr. Albright served as Chief Legislative Assistant to Senator Edmund Muskie, and was a member of the National Security Council staff during the Carter Administration. Dr. Albright has also been Senior Foreign Policy Advisor to the presidential campaigns of former Vice President Walter F. Mondale and Governor Michael S. Dukakis. She is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Endowment for Democracy.

He also served as Chairman of the Select Committee to Investigate Covert Arms Transactions with Iran, and the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence.

Dr. Robert E. Hunter is Vice President for Regional Programs and Director of European Studies at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) in Washington, D.C. Dr. Hunter has served as Special Advisor on Lebanon to Speaker of the House Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. During the Carter Administration, Dr. Hunter served as Director of West European Affairs and Director of Middle East Affairs of the National Security Council. He was Foreign Policy Advisor to Senator Edward M. Kennedy, and a policy advisor to Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey. Mondale, and is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Democratic Institute for International Affairs.

The Honorable Paul S. Sarbanes has represented the state of Maryland in the United States Senate since 1977. Senator Sarbanes is Chairman of the Joint Economic Committee; a member of the Committee on Foreign Relations; and a member of the Committee on Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs. He is also Vice Chairman of the Democratic Policy Committee, and served on the Senate Select Committee on Secret Military Assistance to Iran and the Nicaraguan Opposition. Prior to his election to the Senate, Mr. Sarbanes was a three-term member of the United States House of Representatives, and served in the Maryland House of Delegates.
